#### **CHOREOGRAPHERS**

Joe Celej is a New York City based creative artist whose career spans over twenty years of professional concert dance performance, choreographic investigation, and passionate instruction and mentoring of students. Joe performed for nearly a decade with the internationally acclaimed concert company Elisa Monte Dance, performing extensively throughout the US, Europe, and Asia including theaters in Paris, Rome, and many seasons at the prestigious Joyce Theater in NYC. He was also honored to both meet and perform for the Duke and Duchess of Luxembourg. Joe has performed works by renowned artists including Elisa Monte, Robert Battle, Peter Chu, and Mario Zambrano with additional credits including Houston Grand Opera, Levi Strauss and Company, Wal-Mart, and the City of Houston. Joe's choreography has been presented across the US and Europe and was honored to have his Joyce Theater choreographic premiere in 2011. Joe served as Associate Director of Houston METdance for five seasons and as Resident Choreographer between 2002-2005. Joe is excited to continue his relationship with Houston Contemporary Dance Company as its grant writer and to present Intersections in this anniversary concert! Joe holds a BFA in Dance Performance from SUNY Buffalo and is an honored recipient of a 2010 Presidential Scholar Teacher Recognition Award from the US Department of Education. Joe has been a quest teacher/choreographer at established institutions including Steps on Broadway, SUNY Buffalo, Rice University, Salve Regina University, Ballet Hispanico, and the High School for Performing and Visual Arts Houston (HSPVA). Joe is proud to have mentored numerous dancers who are alumni of prestigious programs including the Juilliard School, the Rambert School, SUNY Purchase, Point Park University, and Pace University, with former students performing with Eastman/Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, LA Dance Project, Lar Lubovitch, Ballet Hispanico, the Radio City Rockettes, and Disney.

Robbie Moore, grew up dancing from age six in Houston, Texas, where he attended the High School for the Performing and Visual Arts. In 2010, he was named Presidential Scholar in the Arts. Robbie graduated from the Juilliard School in 2014. He studied closely with dynamic anatomist Irene Dowd to learn, model and archive her body of work. Robbie toured internationally with L.A. Dance Project, under the direction of Benjamin Millepied, from 2015-2017. In 2019, Robbie moved to Belgium to work for Eastman - Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, where he continues to collaborate. In Antwerp, he trained under Anna Rubau to become a certified True-Pilates instructor. Robbie joined Opera Ballet Vlaanderen as a demi-soloist in 2019. While there he worked with Damien Jalet, Marina Abramović, Johan Inger, Alan Lucien Øyen and Trisha Brown Dance Company. Robbie worked as Resident Choreographer from 2020-21 and continues still as a Guest Artist with HCDC. In 2022, he performed and toured with Ballet du Grand Théâtre de Genève. In 2023, he appeared in Iconoloclast's commercial ad for Lady Gaga x Dom Pérignon directed by Yoann Lemoine. That same year, he performed in the Loubi Show for Paris Fashion Week directed by Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui. Robbie looks forward to working aboard the EUROPA 2 in a new Stepping Grounds production imagined by Alexander Ekman in June 2024. He currently resides in Houston working as a freelance dancer, Pilates instructor, movement coach and choreographer.

Andrea Dawn Shelley, a native of Miami, Florida, received her classical ballet training predominately from Magdalena Maury and Magda G. Auñon. Ms. Shelley received additional summer training at intensives such as Boston Ballet, Houston Ballet and Joffrey Ballet. She studied dance at the University of South Florida under Gretchen Ward Warren and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Dance Education from Florida International University. Andrea has danced professionally with Southern Ballet Theatre, Maximum Dance Company, Miami Contemporary Dance Company, Dominic Walsh Dance Theater, State Street Ballet and iMEE. She is the Co-Founding Director of iMEE Dance Company, est. 2009. As a choreographer, Shelley has created original works commissioned by professional dance companies and festivals such as: iMEE, Ballet Florida, Miami Contemporary Dance Company, Dominic Walsh Dance Theater, State Street Ballet, O Dance, Ad Deum Dance Company, The Dance Gallery Festival / Level UP, palcoscenico danza, METdance, Island Moving Co., the black box INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL THEATRE & DANCE, Festival Ballet Providence, Bellingham Repertory Dance, 16th Annual Mid-Atlantic Choreographic Showcase, Houston Contemporary Dance Company and Vitacca Ballet. Her choreographic works have been presented throughout the United States, Mexico and Europe. She has participated in Residencies and created original works for dance programs such as: Sam Houston State University, High School for the Performing and Visual Arts Houston, Salve Regina University, Providence College, Western Kentucky University, Moorpark College and St. John's School. Currently, Ms. Shelley serves as Ballet Mistress and Rehearsal Assistant for Houston Contemporary Dance Company as well as Rehearsal Director for Vitacca Ballet in Houston, TX.

Jack Wolff, joined Houston Ballet in 2018, and is currently a Demi Soloist. Originally from Houston, Wolff started his training at Precision Dance Academy, Houston METtoos, and Houston Ballet Summer Intensives. In 2015, he moved to NYC to train at American Ballet Theatre's JKO School on full scholarship. While living in NYC, Wolff was awarded YoungArts winner in Tap, represented the JKO School at ABT at Prix de Lausanne, and at 16 years old made his professional debut in Bulgaria as a guest artist with iMEE: a company under the direction of Spencer Gavin Hering and Andrea Dawn Shelley. Since being in the company at Houston Ballet, he has worked with respected choreographers such as Arthur Pita, Justin Peck, Azure Barton, Disha Zhang, and Trey McIntyre. He has also been featured in many works of Stanton Welch's. Some of his memorable roles include Peter in Trey McIntyre's Peter Pan, Benvolio in Stanton Welch's Romeo and Juliet, and the Prince Welch's Cinderella. Jack Wolff also has a passion for choreography, and has created works for Houston Ballet II, Houston Ballet main company, Philadelphia Ballet II, and Houston Contemporary Dance Company.
